

ORDINANCE NO. 19

Master of Science

(Sec. 37(11) and 39(1))

The examination for the degree of Master of Science shall consist of two parts :-

- (a) The Previous examination
- (b) The Final examination or
- (c) Semester system Examination as per Ordinance No. 38

A candidate after obtaining the degree of Bachelor of Science of the University or any other University/Deemed University/Institution recognised by the University to be equivalent there to and completing a regular course of study for one academic year in a School of Studies or any affiliated college shall be admitted to the previous examination for the degree of Master of Science.

A candidate who after passing the M.Sc. previous examination of the University has completed a regular course of study for one academic year in a School of Studies or a college affiliated to the University shall be admitted to the Final examination of Master of Science in the subject in which he has passed the previous examination.

Provided further that a candidate who has passed the M.Sc. previous examination from another University of the state or any other University recognised by the University for the purpose may also be admitted to the Final examination course of study for one academic year in a School of Study or an affiliated college.

The examination shall be partly by means of papers and partly by practicals including sessionals, except in case of mathematics where the examination shall be by means of theory papers only.

The subject of the examination shall be any one of the following :-

- (i) Mathematics
- (ii) Physics
- (iii) Chemistry
- (iv) Botany

- (v) Zoology
- (vi) Bio-Chemistry
- (vii) Military Science
- (viii) Statistics
- (iv) Geology (Earth Science)

6. A candidate passing the M.Sc. examination of this University in any subject shall be allowed to appear for any one or two optional papers in the subject not taken by the candidate earlier. If successful, the candidate shall be given a certificate to that effect.

7. For both the previous and final examinations a candidate shall be declared successful on obtaining atleast 36 % marks in the aggregate and atleast 20 % marks in each paper individually. Provided that in subjects in which theory and practical examinations are held an examiner must obtain separately 36% of marks in each.

8. No division will be assigned on the result of M.Sc. Previous examination. The division in which a candidate is placed shall be determined on the basis of aggregate of marks obtained in both, the M.Sc. previous and M.Sc. final examinations.

9. Successful candidate who obtains 60 % or more of the aggregate marks shall be placed in the First division. those obtaining less than 60 % and not less than 48 % in the second division and all the other successful candidates obtaining less than 48 % in the third division.

10. A candidate having B.Sc. pass degree shall be allowed to appear in one of the three subjects of his degree but the candidate having an honours degree shall allowed to appear in M.Sc. of that subject only in which he has obtained the honours degree.
