

ORDINANCE NO. 27

MASTER OF EDUCATION

(Sec. 37(i) and 39(i))

The courses of study for the Degree of Master of Education shall be of the duration of one Academic Year consisting of the two parts, namely :-

(i) Part I - Theory

(ii) Part II - Practical, Dissertation & Viva-Voce.

(i) A candidate, who holds the Degree of Bachelor of Education of this University or of any other University recognised by the University as equivalent thereto entitled to appear at the M.Ed. Examination who has secured atleast Second Division marks in both the theory & practical Examinations separately, and Bachelor of Education Degree or any Examination recognised as equivalent thereto with atleast Second Division marks in both theory and practical separately in case where the division is awarded on the aggregate of marks obtained in Theory & Practical and in both the parts.

Provided further a candidate who, holds the Master's Degree in Arts, Science, Commerce, Agriculture along with the Degree of Bachelor of Education as above shall also be eligible for admission in M.Ed..

(ii) A candidate who has presented a regular course of study for one academic year in any affiliated college to the University shall be eligible to appear in the examination of Master of Education.

There shall be University examination ordinarily in March / April each year.

Subject to the provisions of this ordinance, the scheme of examination, the syllabus and text books, if any, to be prescribed or recommended related to the subject for the examination covered by the ordinance and the conditions on which the students shall be admitted to the said examination shall be in accordance with the provisions made under the regulation to be made by the Academic Council after considering the recommendations of the Board of Studies and the Faculty of Education.

(i) A candidate shall obtain atleast 39 % marks in each paper in the written examination of Part I and 40 % marks in the aggregate Part II and 48 % marks in total aggregate of both the parts to pass the examination.

(ii) The division shall be determined on the following basis namely :-

First Division 60 % and above	] Of the Aggregate Total Marks.
Second Division 48 % and above	

A candidate, who fails in any/or both the parts, he/she can appear at a subsequent examination in that part only.

Provided the candidate who fails in Part II may submit the previous dissertation after necessary modification to do so if/his supervisor so advises such candidate may also submit laboratory practical record with such modifications.

(i) A candidate who fails in both the parts can appear at a subsequent examination as an Ex-student.
