

ORDINANCE NO. 31

BACHELOR OF MEDICINE & BACHELOR OF SURGERY M.B.B.S

(Sec. 37 (i) and 39 (i))

DURATION OF COURSE

1. The course of study for the M.B.B.S degree shall be of four and half years duration followed by one year compulsory rotating internship. It shall consist of 3 parts, each part extending over a period of 18 months. There shall be a University examination at the end of each part and these examinations shall be called as First professional examination, the Second professional examination and the Final professional examination.

2. Every student after passing the Final professional examination shall be required to undergo for a period of one year the rotating internship to the satisfaction of the Dean, Medical College, to make him eligible for the award of degree of M.B.B.S. and for registration.

3. The first 18 months shall be occupied in the study of first professional (pre clinical) subjects and no student shall be permitted to join the Second professional, until he has passed in all the First professional subjects, for which he will be permitted not more than four chances (actual examination), provided four chances are completed in 3 years.

4. After passing pre-clinical subjects, 3 years shall be devoted to clinical subjects and pre-clinical subjects concurrently, subjects will be taught with the clinical subjects, collaterally and concurrently.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION :

No candidate shall be eligible for admission to this course unless :

- (i) He/She has completed the age of 17 years on or before the 31st December of the year of admission; and
- (ii) He/She has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2 Scheme) conducted by M.P. Board with Physics, Chemistry and Biology or any other examination recognised as equivalent thereto by this University with the same group of subjects as mentioned above ; and
- (iii) He/She has qualified at the Pre-Medical Examination conducted by Purv Vyavsayak Pariksha Board, Bhopal

after securing the qualifying marks in each subject as well as in aggregate.

Provided that in respect of candidates belonging to the scheduled castes/scheduled tribes, the minimum qualifying marks at the Pre-medical Examination shall be reduced by 10% from the percentage required for candidates of general category unless the State Government decides otherwise.

ENROLMENT

6. On admission, each student will be required to get himself enrolled in the University on or before the prescribed date after filling the enrolment form, paying the enrolment fee and submitting the migration certificate if necessary; provided he/she is not already enrolled as a student of this University.

No student shall be deemed to have been admitted to the course of study as a regular student of the Medical College unless his/her name is borne on the regular list of enrolled students of the University.

EXAMINATION :

7. In respect of each professional there shall be two examinations in a year with an interval of 4 to 6 months between the two examinations as far as possible.

8. (a) First Professional Examination - Every candidate who has attended a regular course of study for 18 months after admission to the Medical College shall be eligible for appearing at the first professional M.B.B.S. examination.
- (b) Second Professional Examination - A candidate who after passing the first professional examination of the University, has attended a regular course of study for 18 months shall be eligible for appearing at the second professional examination.
- (c) Final Professional Examination - The final professional shall be held in two parts. A candidate who after passing First Professional Examination has pursued the prescribed course of study for two and a half years and has already passed the Second Professional Examination shall be eligible to appear in Part I of the Final Professional Examination. Every candidate who has passed the Part I of the final professional examination has attended further prescribed course of study for six months shall be eligible to appear in Part II of Final Professional

Examination. Such other candidates who after appearing at the Part I examination and filling in one or both the subjects of that examination after attending further prescribed course of study for six months shall also be eligible to appear in part II of the Final Professional Examination, besides the subject/subjects have not been cleared by them at the part I examination.

9. (a) A candidate in order to pass at the First and Second Professional Examination is required to secure 50% in the aggregate of each subject separately, with a minimum of 50% in theory in each subject, as well.
- (b) A candidate in order to pass at the Part I examination of the final professional is required to obtain 50% in the aggregate marks of two subjects, viz. Ophthalmology and E.N.T. subject to a minimum of 50% in each of the two subjects.
- (c) A candidate in order to pass at the part II of the Final Professional M.B.B.S. Examination will be required to obtain 50% in the aggregate of each subject separately with atleast 50% marks in the clinical examination.
10. A candidate who has passed in any subject need not appear in that subject again and any subsequent examination.
11. A candidate securing 75% or more marks in a subject shall be deemed to have obtained distinction in the subjects if the candidate passes in all examinations in all subjects and without any failure and in the minimum prescribed period.
12. The name of first ten successful candidates, who have passed in all professional examinations without any failure and in the minimum prescribed period, shall be declared in order of merit after taking together the aggregate marks obtained in all the Three Professional Examinations.
13. The University shall issue a provisional M.B.B.S. pass certificate on passing the Final Professional Examination.
14. The State Medical Council will grant provisional registration to the candidate on production of marks sheet of the Final Professional Examination.

INTERNSHIP :

15. The compulsory rotating internship is to be done in teaching non-teaching approved hospitals like District Hospitals and Rural Health Training Centre/upgraded Primary Health Centres attached to the teaching institutions.

16. The Dean shall issue certificates of satisfactory completion of training of 12 months and on the basis of it the University shall award the M.B.B.S. Degree.

17. CURRICULUM :

Subject to the provisions of this ordinance, the Scheme of Examinations and the curriculum for the course shall be in accordance with the recommendations of the Board of Studies as approved by the Faculty of Medicine.
