

ORDINANCE NO. 46

Part Time Course in Master in Chemicals, Sales
and Marketing Management

The part-time course for the Master in Chemicals, Sales and Marketing Management will be divided into six semesters covering three academic sessions only. Each semester normally comprise 90 (ninety) working days.

Eligibility :

(a) M.Sc. in Chemistry/Biochemistry/Microbiology/Botany/
Zoology

(b) B.Sc. with Chemistry/Biochemistry/B.Pharma/B.Sc.(Ag).

Second Class degree of Jiwaji University/Deemed
University/Institute recognised by the University.

Admission to the course will be given to the candidates strictly on merit. The details will be finalised by the department and approval of the Vice-Chancellor taken and published every year in the prospectus.

English is the only medium of instruction and examination for this course.

In order to organise extracurricular activities, the students of the course will have a chemical society.

5. The department will have a placement cell.

6. The department will have an Alumni Association in order to have interaction with those who have graduated from this department.

7. Examination fee, admission fee and other fee will be in accordance with the decision of the department/university for the said course from time to time.

A student of this programme will not be permitted to take up any other course simultaneously. However, restriction shall not be applicable to the students of language, certificate course, computer classes, or remedial classes.

Scheme of Examination :

The examination of first semester, second semester, third semester and fifth semester shall consist of four (04) theory papers of 100 marks each of which 70 marks shall be for university examination and 30 marks for internal assessment. Two tests of 15 marks each and one make up test for each course shall be held on the dates specified by the Head/Coordinator of the department/school of studies. The marks of the test will be counted as the award for internal assessment.

The fourth semester and sixth semester will consist in two theory papers of 100 marks each of which 70 marks shall be for university examination and 30 marks for internal assessment.

The fourth semester consist in project and sixth semester an industrial training of four weeks. The candidate will submit a project report followed by evaluation and viva. The total marks for this project report is 200 each semester. Out of 200, the training and report will comprise 150 marks and viva 50 marks. An external examiner will be called to evaluate and to conduct the viva. For 4-5 candidates one management expert from University/Industry/Institute can be invited.

First Semester, Second Semester, Third Semester and Fifth Semester:

Four (04) theory papers of 100 marks each. The break-up of each paper i.e., 100 marks :

Two (02) theory papers of 100 marks each. The break-up of each paper i.e., 100 marks.

Fifth Semester :

Two (02) theory papers of 100 marks each. The break-up of each paper i.e., 100 marks.

Viva	:	50	

A candidate failing in any one course/paper of first semester examination shall be allowed to continue in the second semester. In the second semester the candidate has to appear in that paper of first semester (in which he/she has failed). The candidate who has cleared all the papers of first semester but failed in any one paper of second semester shall be promoted to third semester. The candidate who has passed all

the papers of first and second semesters but have failed in one paper of third semester will be promoted to fourth semester. The candidate who has cleared all the papers of first, second, third semesters but failed in any one paper of fourth semester shall be promoted to fifth semester. The candidate who has cleared all the papers of first, second, third and fourth semesters but failed in any one paper of fifth semester will be promoted to sixth semester. The candidate who has cleared first, second, third, fourth and fifth semesters but fails in any paper of sixth semester can appear in that paper as an ex-student in the next semester.

If a candidate has failed in more than one paper he/she will be allowed to appear as an ex-student in the whole examination of that semester in which he/she thus failed. Such candidate if passed in that examination will be entitled for admission as a regular student in the next semester, if any.

For such additional attempts the university shall charge additional examination fee as notified by the university time to time.

No candidate shall be allowed more than two attempts (including the original attempt) in a particular semester. If that candidate does not succeed in two attempts too, he/she will have to leave that course.

The result of the first, second, third, fourth and fifth semesters shall be declared as pass/fail. The final result for the degree will be declared after the sixth semester. The sum total of all the marks secured by the candidates will be counted and division shall be awarded on the basis of the marks secured, as follows :

First division	:	60% or above marks in aggregate
Second division	:	Less than 60% but 48% or more in aggregate.
Third division	:	Less than 48% but 40% or more in aggregate.
