

ORDINANCE FOR THE MASTER OF RURAL MANAGEMENT ( M.R.M.)

TWO YEARS (FOUR SEMESTERS) FULL TIME PROGRAMME

The Ordinance provides for admission, examination and other incidental matters relating to the Master of Rural Management, two years (Four Semesters) Full time programme spread over four semesters; two semesters in the first year and two semesters in the second year.

ADMISSION :

A candidate seeking admission to the first semester of the course shall be required to :

1) Possess a Bachelor's or a Master Degree in any discipline with atleast second division (at least 45% marks in aggregate).  
2) Relaxation can be granted in 45% marks in aggregate except to those who belong to SC/ST/OBC they will be given a relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum of their qualifying examination. Their seats will be reserved as per M.P. Govt. rules.

The Candidates who are in service willing to join this course, will have to produce a no-objection certificate with two years leave from his/her employer. In case he/she fails to produce the same latest at the time of Interview, his/her candidature will not be considered.

Admission to first semester shall be made on the basis of admission process consisting of a written test and personality test carrying a total weightage of 100 marks. The detailed rules of selection procedure through the written test and personality test will be framed and notified by the M.R.M. Admission Committee of the School of Studies in Rural Management year to year.

An applicant for the M.R.M. examination prosecuting a Full-time course of study leading to the Master of Rural Management will not be permitted to take up any other examination or course, simultaneously.

No person shall be admitted to any university or statutory body. However, this restriction shall not be applicable to Diploma holders.

The candidate who has passed any part of M.R.M. Programme of this university or Institution will not be admitted to M.R.M. Programme at this university on migration basis.

Each candidate will have to complete the minimum 75% attendance in each semester.

Each candidate will have to go for field work and submit a field work report relating to any rural area/organisation after the second semester. This report will have to be submitted by him/her in third semester for valuation.

In IV Semester, each candidate will have to carryout a Project work on any topic approved by Faculty council of the department of Rural Management and submit his Project Report for valuation atleast 10 days before the commencement of IVth Semester examination.

#### EXAMINATION :

(1) Subject to the provisions of this ordinance, the scheme of examination and the syllabus and text books, will be prescribed or recommended in connection with any subject for any of the examination covered by this ordinance and the conditions on which the students shall be admitted to such examination, shall be in accordance with the provisions made by the Academic Council after considering the recommendations of concerned Board of Studies and the Faculty of Management.

(2) Each examination shall be regarded as a separate unit for the purpose of working out the result of the candidate. The result of each examination shall be worked out separately even if he/she has appeared at the course in which he/she failed previously, along with the course in which he/she is appearing for the first-time. For getting success, he/she must have secured atleast 40% marks in the individual courses/papers. For the purpose of calculation of this 40% pass percentage, the score in internal assessment and in the university examination will be counted together.

3) A student will be promoted to the next semester only after having passed atleast four papers of current semester out of total six (6) papers. In the remaining two (2) papers he/she can appear again with the ensuing concerning semester examination as back paper. This is to be done by him/her in the two subsequent semester examinations.

4) A candidate will be allowed only two additional attempts other than the original attempt) to pass any course. If somebody fails to do so he/she may in the appear as an entire examinations of the concerned semester as an ex-student.

5) The medium of instruction and examination for this programme shall be English/Hindi.

6) (1) Candidate appearing in any semester exams as an ex-student shall be examined in accordance with the existing scheme and syllabi in force at that time.

(ii) Candidate shall be entitled to the award of the degree of the year in which all the courses are cleared by him/her.

7) Division shall be ~~xx~~ awarded on the following basis :

First Division with distinction

- 75% marks or above in aggregate.

First Division

- 60% and above in aggregate.

Second Division

- 48% and above but below 60% in aggregate.

Pass

- 40% and above but below 48% in aggregate.

8) A student of M.R.M. (Any Semester) will be entitled to the benefit of Vice Chancellor's grace of one marks for passing the examination of any semester or obtaining the next division (if he loses the next division by only one mark in aggregate).

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- (9) The course structure, procedure of admission test will be finalised by Head and Dean of M.R.M. Programme under the guidance of Board of Studies in Management, subject to the approval of faculty of Management and Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.
