

Development

- Development by German jurist otto von Gierke.
 - .It originated in the last quarter of the nineteenth century.
 - .The advocates of pluralism are Harold J. Laski, Ernst Barker, Maciver and G.D.H.cole.

Merits

- It not only includes government and law but also social relation between men and multisided human beings.
 - The Pluralists enthusiastically supported the freedom of profession, political, religious, economic, social and educational associations.

Principles of the pluralism

 Various associations such as churches and trade, unions are important in a state.

. Pluralism stands for decentralization of government authority.

Criticism

Sovereignty can't be divided among various associations.

• Several pluralists believe that law is superior to the state and the state is controlled by law. But this hypothesis is incorrect because laws are outlined by the state.
