ORDINANCE NO. 20

BACHELOR OF ARTS

(Sec. 37(11) and 39(1)

The courses of study for the degree of Eachelor of Arts shall be of Three Years duration and shall consist of three parts, namely:

(i) B.A. Part I

(11) B.A. Fart 11

(iii)B.A. Fart III

- (i) A candidate who, after passing Higher Secondary Examination or Intermediate Examination under 10+2 Pattern of M.P. Board of Secondary Education or any other examination recognised by the University of M.P. Board of Secondary Education as equivalent there to, shall be admitted to the B.A. Part I Examination.
- (ii) A candidate after passing the B.A. Part 1 Examination of this University shall be admitted to the B.A. PartII Examination.
- (iii)A candidate after passing the B.A. Part II Examination of this University shall be admitted to the B.A. Part III, also known as B.A. (Final) Examination.

There shall be a University Examination at the end of each part ordinarily in March/April in each year.

- (i) There shall be a suppplementary Examination Ordinarily in August/September each year.
- (ii) The following shall be eligible to appear at the Supplementary Examination.
 - (a) Candidate who have failed in not more than one subject or paper as the case may be.

Provided in the case of subject/subjects in which there is also a practical test, a candidate shall be required to appear in the written papers only if he/she has passed at the main examination in practical and in practical only if he/she has passed in the written papers.

Further provided where an examinee failed both in written papers and practicals shall be examined in both the parts or the subject.

(iii)A candidate who has been declared eligible for a Supplementary examination may appear as a

supplementary candidate in the two examinations immediately following the Examination in which he/she was declared to be eligible and thereafter he/she shall be required to appear in all the subjects or papers as the case may be.

Subject to the provision of this Ordinance, the Scheme of Examinations the syllabus and the text books, if any, to be prescribed or recommended in connection with the subject for any of the examination covered by this Ordinance and the conditions on which the students shall be admitted to the said examination shall be in accordance with the provisions made by or under the regulations to be made by the Academic Council after considering the recommendations of the Board of Studies and Faculties concerned.

Every candidate of B.A. Part I, II, and III shall be required to offer the subjects as per Scheme of Examination prescribed for each part.

For the purposes of the provision contained in the ordinance relating to Examinations (General), 'a regular course of study' means attendance of at least seventy five percent of Lectures delivered in each subject or Course of instructions at the end of the First Year, Second Year and Third Year, the attendance being calculated upto a date two weaks immediately preceding the date of the commencement of the written examination.

A candidate may appear as Non-Collegiate candidate in B.A. Part I, B.A. Part II and B.A. Part III Examinations.

- (i) A candidate shall be required to pass separately in each subject in each of the Part I, II and III Examination.
- (ii) Passing in each subject shall mean obtaining of the minimum pass marks in theory and practical examinations separately in written paper or papers in each subject at the University Examination and obtaining of the minimum 33 % pass marks in each subject in theory and practical separately and in the aggregate.
- (i) No division shall be assigned on the result of B.A. Part I, B.A. Part II and B.A. Part III. The result of B.A. Part III shall be determined by adding to total marks secured at B.A. Part 1.1[and1]1 examinations and the division shall be awarded on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained by the candidates.
- (ii) The marks obtained by the candidate/candidates in Supplementary examination shall be taken into account in determining the division at the examination.
