ORDINANCE NO. 36.

BACHELOR OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE

(Sec. 37 (ii) and 39 (i))

The course of study for the degree in Library and Information Science shall be of one year duration.

The minimum qualification for admission to the course shall be :-

a. Second Class Eachelor's Degree.

OR

- b. Second Class Master's Degree of this University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto.
- c. Students shall be selected strictly on merit basis. However certain seats may be reserved by the department for the deputed/in service candidates. Such deputed candidates should possess at least a Bachelor's degree.

Prescribed number of seats will be reserved for deputed/inservice candidates. Such candidates will be required to produce a certificate of having worked atleast for three successive years in a recognised Library as a whole time paid worker performing duties of semi-professional nature. The deputed/in service candidates will be required to work as full time students like other students.

A candidate who was admitted to the course as a regular candidate and was not able to appear in the examination though admission card was correctly issued to him/her by the University may appear in the said examination as Ex-Student.

For the purposes of the provision contained in the ordinance relating to Examination (G) regular courses of study means attendance of atleast seventy five percent of lectures delivered in each paper or course of instruction at the end of the sessions.

Each candidate shall have to become a minimum of 25 % in each Theory paper and 40 % in sessionals and 40 % in total aggregate. Candidates who fail either in sessional or in any one of the papers will be considered to have failed in the examination. Those who fail in other papers will be exempted in sessional from appearing in sessional work in the subsequent attempts and their sessional marks will be

carried forward. However, the candidate will have to appear in viva-vice. Marks obtained in internal assessment will be added in the aggregate. The candidates securing 60% or more marks in the aggregate will be awarded a First Division, those securing 50% or more marks will be awarded a Second Division and all others will be awarded Third Division.

A Candidate who fails by a total of not more than there marks in not more than two subjects, but secures more than the minimum aggregate marks required shall be given three grace marks to enable him to pass the examination. The candidate who fails in the final examination will have to reappear in all the papers in the next annual examination.

Medium of instructions in B. Lib. Science shall be Hindi or English provided that a candidate may at his option answer the questions either in Hindi or in English.
