

Ordinance No. 55 - Master's of Physical Education  
(MPE) Regular 2 Years

---

Rules of Admission for Masters of Physical Education  
(MPEd) 2 years Regular.

Admission requirements and procedure for admission in two years Master's of Physical Education Course (Regular) at School of Studies in Phy. Education & Sports Sciences shall be as follows :

1. Eligibility Rules:

- 1.1 The applicant must be having a degree of Bachelors of Physical Education i.e. BPEd or BPE of this university or of any Indian University recognised for the purpose of eligibility by Jiwaji University or after obtaining a Post Graduate Diploma in Phy. Education of at least one year duration awarded by any Indian University or after obtaining Indian or foreign qualification recognised as equivalent to those mentioned above by Jiwaji University, Gwalior shall be eligible to apply for admission to this course.
- 2 The applicant should have secured at least 50% marks in BPEd, BPE or DPEd, which shall be considered as the minimum educational qualification for admission in MPE Regular course. A relaxation of 5% marks shall be given to those applicants who have represented India at International level competitions duly recognised by Indian Olympic Association (I.O.A).
- 4 The inservice candidates have to obtain necessary permission from the competent authority and have to take leave from the parent Dept. to complete the course. The no objection certificate has to be submitted before the Entrance Examination.
- 5 There shall be 40 seats in MPEd course.

1.6 Reservation for SC/ST candidates and candidates belonging to Freedom fighter category shall be in accordance with the rules prevailing in the University from time to time. However, if the candidates in these categories are not available, the vacancies shall be filled with General candidates who have qualified in the admission test and are in merit.

1.7 Married women are also eligible for admission to both the courses, but if a women candidate admitted to these courses reaches the stage of expectancy during the course, she will have to discontinue her studies for that particular session and shall be allowed to continue her studies next year.

1.8 Candidates expelled from any other college or dismissed from Government Service on disciplinary grounds and those who are known to have been involved in acts of crime and gross indiscipline or misbehaviour will not be eligible for admission.

1.9 Admission is granted to the candidates on their own risk and responsibility as per details furnished by them. If any time, it is noticed that admission has been obtained by any candidate by giving incorrect or false or concealing information or oversight, the admission granted will be cancelled and the candidate shall be asked to leave the dept. forth with after testing the accounts.

## 2. CRITERIA OF ADMISSION

### 2.1 MEDICAL FITNESS TEST

Each candidate will be medically examined by the University medical officer and only those found fit will be admitted to these courses.

### 2.2 WRITTEN TEST OF SPORTS GENERAL KNOWLEDGE Total 75 Marks

In the written test, a candidate should score a minimum of 40% marks. The written test is to test the ability and aptitude of a candidate in general knowledge about sports, Aerobics and Ply. Edu. The



## 2.3 MOTOR FITNESS TEST :

Total 100 Marks

The test items will be as under and each item shall be of 20 marks.

- a. 50 M. Run.
- b. Medicine Ball Throw (Backward double arm overhead throw from standing position.)
- c. Standing Broad Jump.
- d. Shuttle Run (4 x 10 M.)
- e. 600/M Run/Walk

## 2.4 PLAYING ABILITY :

Total 100 Marks

Each candidate shall be tested for playing ability in any one of the game/sports as mentioned below :-  
Hockey, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Cricket, Judo, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Gymnastics, Aquatics, Handball, Lawn Tennis, Table Tennis, Weight Lifting, Boxing, Best physique, Wrestling, Chess, Aerobics & Athletics.

## GROUP DISCUSSION :

Total 25 Marks

The candidates shall be called for group discussion in which sports related and general topics shall be given to the group for discussion. Each candidate participation on the topic shall be evaluated out of 25 marks by experts.

## PERSONALITY TEST CUM-INTERVIEW: Total 10 Marks

Each Candidate shall have to face interview committee for personality test cum interview. The candidate shall be awarded marks out of ten by each of the committee member independently.

## BREAK OF MARKS FOR PERSONAL SPORTS ACHIEVEMENTS: 40 Marks

The allocation of marks for personal sports achievement shall be on the basis of production of certificate about the level of participation by the candidate in those games/sports which are recognised by Indian Olympic Association (I.O.A.). The marks allocated for each level shall be as follows

11.	participation at/All India/West Zone Intersarsity Championship - First place of the team	02 marks
12.	Gold Medalist of Inter collegiate Championship of any University	01 marks

#### IMPORTANT NOTE :

The marking for practical Motor fitness test shall be done in accordance with the norms developed and revised by the School of Studies from time to time. For personal sport achievement, the candidate shall be awarded marks only for the heighest performance in any one of the game he has played.

#### ADMISSION LIST

The lists of candidates qualified (N<sup>o</sup> 40) on the basis of merit to be admitted to these courses will be put up on the notice board soon after the completion of admission tests. Candidates therefore should come fully prepared to join the course if selected. Admission will be confirmed only on payment of tuition fees and other dues, within 3 days of admission in cash or in the form of crossed bank draft in favour of Director P.E. Jiwaji University, Gwalior payable at Central Bank of India, Jiwaji University, Gwalior. Non payment of fees or failure to report on prescribed dates will automatically cancel the admission.



## COURSE STRUCTURE

14-

There shall be eight written papers for M.P.E. examination. Of these four shall be offered by a candidate for the Previous Examination and four for the Final Examination. Each paper shall carry 100 marks for both the Previous and the final examinations, candidates must obtain for a pass at least 45% in each paper and 45% of the aggregate marks in each examination including sessional. The marks of the two examination (Previous and final) will count together for place on pass list of the final examination. No division will be assigned on the result of previous Examination.

1st Division	60% and above	of the aggregate marks
2nd Division	45% and above but below 60%	

A candidate shall have the option of submitting thesis in lieu of one paper for M.P.E. Final Examination provided he/she has obtained at least 60% of the aggregate marks in the Previous Examination. The topic of the thesis must be approved by the Dean, Faculty of Physical Education before 1st of September preceding the year in which the thesis will be presented.

A candidate selecting this option must submit his/her thesis not less than one week before the beginning of the Final Examination and present himself/herself for a Viva-Voce Examination at the time of the Final Examination.

When a candidate has failed in the examination but has obtained pass marks in the Thesis, the thesis marks may be carried forward at his option to two subsequent years without fresh assessment. If a student fails in thesis but secures pass marks in M.P.E. Previous and Final Examination, the candidate will be permitted to complete his requirement for thesis in two subsequent years and on doing so, will be awarded the degree of Master of Physical Education.

Those candidate who fail in one paper only in the M.P.E. (Final Examination held in April every year but obtain 45% of the aggregate marks shall be eligible to appear in a supplementary examination, in the paper in which they have failed in M.P.E. (Final) to be held as far as possible in September, every year subsequent to the main examination.

For the M.P.E. (Final) supplementary examination the result shall be declared on the basis of the marks actually obtained by them in each of the papers they passed in the Annual Examination plus the marks obtained in the papers in which they take the supplementary examination and division will be awarded on the total of such marks. Such candidates however, will be ineligible for a place on the merit list.

### CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students are expected to maintain excellent conduct both inside and outside the Deptt. of Phy Edu., Jiwaji University and Hostels. They will be supplied with a copy of Rules on admission of the Deptt. of Phy. Edu., Breach of Deptt./University. Rules result in disciplinary action including expulsion or rystication from the University. The University reserves the right to make any change in these rules at any time which will be notified to the students for compliance.

### SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

The Scheme of Examination shall be based on Internal assessment as well as on external examination. University Semester exams. The Scheme of internal assessment is as follow :-

- [i] In each semester and for each theory subject/course there shall be three internal assessment test to be conducted by the teachers teaching respective subject.
- [ii] Two best class tests of three test shall be considered for internal assessment.
- [iii] Candidate shall be required to secure atleast a minimum of 30% marks in individual course/subject in order to pass the internal assessment.
- [iv] In case of practical papers the Examination shall be conducted by the respective teacher in which practical skill test and playing ability shall be of 70 marks and written test shall be of 30 marks.
- [v] A candidate must put in each semester a minimum of 85% of attendance on theory and practical classes separately and the attendance shall be reckoned in terms of working days. lectures and practical attended by the candidate separately.
- [vi] In order to get promotion to the next Semester, candidates will have to clear at least 50% courses out of the courses of the concerning Semester. The remaining courses [back papers] have to be cleared by him/her in the next Semester alongwith Second Semester Examination.
- [vii] An Examinee who has failed in more than two papers in main Examination or in internal assessment test shall be required to register himself/herself for doing the sessional work/university examination at the school of studies on payment of a fresh fees of Rs. 100/- for each subject for Examination.

- [iii] The internal assessment awards of a candidate who fails in University Examination shall be carried forward to the next year Examination.
- [ix] In case a candidate fails in any of the semester examinations shall be allowed one attempt more to clear the course. However if a candidate fails to pass in semester examination even after one additional attempt other than the original one, he/she will be required to leave the course.
- [x] The result of the examination shall be given separately in the Degree certificate under three Heads i.e. part A-Theory, part B - Practical and part C- Project work.
- [xi] To pass in Theory, practical and project work, a candidate must secure at least 40% marks in each theory, practical and project work separately.
- [xii] The division shall be awarded to the successful candidates on the following criteria :
  - a] DISTINCTION - 75% and above in the paper concerned.
  - b] FIRST DIVISION - 60% & above of the aggregate marks, but below 75%
  - c] SECOND DIVISION - 45% and above but below 60%
  - d] THIRD DIVISION - Above 40% but below 45%
- [xiii] An Examinee, who fails by a total of not more than three marks in any one paper in any of the semester examination but secures more than the minimum aggregate 40% marks required including sessional marks in each paper, shall be given three grace marks to enable him to pass the examination. Private candidates shall not be allowed to appear at the BPE and CCAF examination. The candidates who appear at these examinations and fails shall however be permitted to appear at semester Examinations as ex-students.
