ORDINANCE NO. 69

AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 2003-2004

INTRODUCTION

The ammended Ordinance provides Regulations for Admissions , Examination and Training in Homoeopathy Curriculum, leading to the award of degree of BHMS(Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine & Surgery) , in accordance with the Homoeopathy (Degree course) Regulation 1983 amended by Amendment Regulations 2003, notified by Central Council of Homoeopathy, New Delhi , governed by Deptt. of Public Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, following are additions / substitutions in BHMS curriculum Ordinance No. 69 :-

PART-I

Regulation 1 : Implementation of Amended Regulations:

- (i) These Amendments shall be deemed as effective, with implementation of Notification dated 24th September 2003, issued by the Central Council of Homoeopathy (CCH), New Delhi, published in the Gazette of India, Part III, Section :4, No. 147 dated 25th Sept. 2003.
- (ii) These Amendment Regulations 2003 shall apply to the students admitted for BHMS curriculum, from the commencement of Session : 2003-2004.
- (iii) However, to these Amendments, any specific modifications consequently notified by the CCH, shall be applicable to the concerned students, admitted prior to or in the session 2003-2004, accordingly.

PART II**COURSES OF STUDY & TRAINING**

- (i) The course of study for the BHMS degree shall be of four and half years duration followed by one year Compulsory Rotating Internship. The period of study shall be divided into four parts.

IV(Final) BHMS	12 months

- (ii) After passing the final BHMS Examination, each candidate shall be required to undergo compulsory Rotating Internship of one year duration, after completion of the Internship in accordance with Annexure-A (Regulation 3(ii) CCH : Homoeopathy Degree course amendment regulations : 2003, the candidate shall be eligible for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery(BHMS) as awarded by the University.

PART III**ADMISSION TO THE COURSE**

- (i) No candidate shall be admitted to the BHMS (Degree) Course unless:
- He/She has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2 Scheme) or its equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects conducted by Central or State Boards of Examinations.
 - He/She has attained the age of 17 years on or before 31st Dec. of the year of his/her admission to the first year of course.
- (ii) Selection of candidate for admission to BHMS curriculum shall be subjected to the rules notified by the Directorate of Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy Madhya Pradesh, Bhopal (M.P.) from time to time.
- (iii) Blind (including colour blind), deaf and/or dumb candidates shall not be eligible for admission in the course.

PART-IV**THE CURRICULUM**

Under the provisions of this Ordinance subjects for study and Examination for the BHMS (Degree course) shall be in accordance with the CCH Regulations : Amendments 2003 as under :-

PART V**SYLLABUS**

Under the provisions of this Ordinance, the Syllabus for the Direct Degree course shall be in accordance with the Part V of CCH Regulation No. 6 of Homoeopathy Degree course Amendment Regulation 2003.

PART VI**ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION , SCHEME OF EXAMINATION etc.**

Under the provisions of this Ordinance, the admission to Examination, Scheme of Examination etc. for the Direct Degree course shall be in accordance with the part VI of CCH Regulations 7,8,9, & 10 of Homoeopathy Degree course Amendment Regulations 2003.

RESULT & RE-ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION

The guidelines for Result and Re-Admission to Examinations shall be in accordance with Regulation 11 of the CCH : Homocopathy Degree Course Amendment Regulations : 2003, namely :-

- (i) Examining body may ensure that the results of the examination are published in time so that the students who successfully completes the BHMS examinations can complete the course including Internship in 5½ years after admission.
- (ii) Candidates who have passed in one or more subjects need not appear in that subject or those subjects again in the subsequent examinations if the candidate passes the whole examination within four chances including the original examination.
- (iii) Facility to keep term: Notwithstanding with the foregoing regulations, the students shall be allowed the facility to keep term on the following conditions:
 - (a) The candidate must pass the Second BHMS examination at least one term (6 months) before he is allowed to appear in the Third BHMS

examination.

(b) The candidate must pass the Third BHMS examination at least one term (6 months) before he is allowed to appear in the Fourth BHMS examination.

(c) No candidate shall be given more than 4 chances to appear in First BHMS examination in the same subject.

(iv) A candidate who appears at Second or Third BHMS examinations, but fails to pass in the subject or subjects, he may be admitted to the next examination in the subject or subjects. However candidates shall be allowed to keep term as provided in (iii) above.

a) However, as per CCH notification No. 14-6/2000 - CCH (pt.I) dated 4 Nov.2003 this facility shall be implemented with the examinations of year 2003-04.(Ref. Report dated 27th January 2004, submitted by Examination Committee of the University))

(v) If a candidate fails to pass in all the subjects within four chances in examinations, he shall be required to prosecute a further course of studying all the subjects and in all parts for one year to the satisfaction of the Head of the college and appearing for examination in all the subjects.

Provided that if a student appearing for the Fourth BHMS Examination has only one subject to pass at the end of prescribed chances, he shall be allowed to appear at the next examination in that particular subject and shall complete the examination with the special chance.

(vi) Grace marks may be awarded to the students at the discretion of the University/Examining Body.

a) However as per CCH Notification No. 14-8/2003-CCH dated 17.Feb.2003 this facility shall be implemented with the Examinations of year 2003-04(Ref: Report dated 25.6.2004, submitted by the Examination Committee of the University)

EXAMINERS

Under the provisions of this Ordinance, the appointment of Examiners shall be in accordance with the CCH Regulation No.12 of Homoeopathy Degree course, amendment Regulation 2003, namely :-

No person other than the holder of qualification prescribed for the teaching staff in Homoeopathy (Minimum Standards of Education) Regulation, as amended from time to time, shall be appointed as an Internal or External Examiner or Paper-Setter for the BHMS Degree course.

Provided that : -

(a) No such person shall be appointed as an Examiner unless he has at least three years continuous regular teaching experience in the subject concerned, gained in a degree level of Homoeopathic Medical College.

(b) Internal examiners shall be appointed from amongst the teaching staff of the Homoeopathic Medical College.

(c) A paper setter may be appointed as an Internal or External Examiner.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION AND SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

Under the provisions of this Ordinance, General guidelines for admission to examination and Scheme of Examination for Direct degree course shall be in accordance with the CCH regulation 13 of Homoeopathy Degree Course Amendment Regulation 2003.

MISCELLANEOUS

(i) Authorities empowered to conduct examinations:

The Universities shall conduct the examination for the Degree course various States or the agencies empowered by an Act of Parliament.

(ii) Interpretation:

Where any doubt arises to the interpretation of these regulations it shall be referred to the Central Council for clarification.

(iii) Power to relax:

Where any University, or Medical institution in India which grants medical qualification, is satisfied that the operation of any of these regulations cause undue hardship in any particular case, that University or Medical Institution as the case may be, may by order, for reasons recorded in writing, dispense or relax the requirement of that regulation in such an extent and subject to such exceptions and conditions as it may consider

necessary for dealing with case in a just and equitable manner.

(iv)

Saving Clause:

Any Diploma/Degree qualification, at present included in II or III schedule the Homoeopathy Central Council Act where nomenclature is not consonance with these regulations shall cease to be recognised medical qualification when granted after the commencement of these regulations. However, this clause will not apply to the students who are already admitted to these courses before the enforcement of these regulations.

(v)

Transfer of students from One College to another:

a) A student studying in a Homoeopathic Medical College may be allowed to migrate/transfer to another Homoeopathic Medical College under same or another University.

b) The University concerned can allow the migration/transfer within three months after passing the First BHMS examination, as a rule.

c) Migration/Transfer of students during the course of their training for the clinical subjects may be avoided.

d) The number of students migrating/transferring from one college to another college during one year will be kept to the minimum so that the training of the regular students of that college is not adversely affected. The number of students migrating/transferring to/ from any one college should not exceed the limit of 5% of its intake subject to a maximum of 5 student in any one Homoeopathy college in one year.

e) Cases not covered under the above regulations may be referred to the CCH for consideration on individual merits.

f) Intimation about the admission of migrated/transferred students into any college shall be sent to the CCH forthwith.

INTERNSHIP TRAINING

Under the provisions of this Ordinance Internship training for Direct degree course shall be in accordance with Homoeopathy Degree Course Amendment Regulation 2003.

All above regulations are subject to implementations of further notifications and amendments issued by Central Council of Homoeopathy (CCH), New Delhi from time to time.

This ammended Ordinance, repeals the provisions of the previous Ordinance No. 69 and relevant regulations, if any and presently ammended Ordinance No. 69 comes into force, accordingly.

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Signatures of the Members of the Ordinance

whose course are equivalent and are recognised by State Govt. shall be eligible to apply for this course.

1.2 The applicant should have passed intermediate (with Physics, Chemistry and Biology) which shall be considered as the minimum educational qualification for admission in the proposed course.

1.3 The applicant should not be less than 17 years of age on or before 31st December.

1.4 There shall be 75 seats only in the course, which may be increased by the Governing Body with due permission of the Competent authority.

1.5 Candidates expelled from any other college or dismissed from Government Service on disciplinary grounds and those who are known to have involved in acts of crime and gross indiscipline or misbehaviour will not be eligible for admission.

1.6 Admission is granted to the candidates on their own risks and responsibility as per details furnished by them. If any time, it is noticed that admission has been obtained by any candidates by giving false information or by concealing the facts or oversight, the admission granted will be cancelled and the candidates shall be asked to leave the college forthwith after testing the accounts.

(2) Criteria of Admission :-

2.1 Admission to 1st year B.H.M.S.Course will be made strictly on merit basis.

2.2 Admission List -

The list of candidates qualified N-75 on the basis of merit to be admitted to these course will be put up on

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the notice board soon after the completion of admission procedure. Candidates therefore should come fully prepared to join the course if selected. Admission will be confirmed only on payment of tuition fees and other dues within twenty days of admission in cash or in the form of crossed bank draft in the name of Principal V.R.H. Medical College, Gwalior payable at Union Bank of India P.G.V. College Extension Gwalior. Non payment of fees or failure to report on prescribed dates the admission will be treated as automatically cancelled.

If some vacancies arise later on, the order of merit will be strictly followed from the remaining candidates.

Admission to the proposed course will close on the 14th August for those who are to be admitted from the waiting list No. admission will be made after this period.

Course structure for the Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery :-

(1) The Degree Course of Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery shall comprise a Course of study consisting of Curriculum and syllabus provided in these regulations spread over a period of 5½ years, including compulsory Internship of one year duration after passing the final Degree Examination.

(2) The Internship shall be undertaken at the Hospital attached to the college and in case where such Hospital cannot accomodate all of its students for Internship, such students may undertake their internship in a Hospital or dispensary run by the Centra Government or State Government or Local Bodies.

(3) At the completion of the internship of the specified period and on the recommendation of the Head of

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the Institution where Internship was undertaken, the concerned State Board or University, as the case may be shall issue the Degree to the successful candidate.

Important Rules :-

The College can make any change in the scheme, particularly in the course prescribed in fulfilment.

Conduct and discipline :-

Students are expected to maintain excellent conduct both inside & out side the college. They will be supplied with a copy of rules on admission. Branch of Deptt/rules result in disciplinary action including expulsion or rustication from the college. The college Reserves the right to make any change in these rules at any time which will be notified to students for compliance.
