ORDINANCE - No 72  
Bachelor of Pharmacy  
(Sec. 37 (ii) and 39 (i))

1. The degree of Bachelor of Pharmacy shall be abbreviated as B.Pharma.
2. The course of study shall extend over a period of four full academic years.
3. The minimum qualification for admission to the first year of the course shall be 50% marks at the 10+2 examination of M.P. Higher Secondary Board with General English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics or Biology or any other examination recognised by the University to be equivalent to 10+2 examination. The candidates passing the Diploma in Pharmacy examination recognised by the Pharmacy Council of India shall also be eligible for the admission to this course of study.
4. The admission shall be granted on the basis of the merit secured at the entrance test conducted by the University for this purpose.
5. A student admitted to this course shall not be permitted to take up studies in any other course except the certificate courses of computer, languages and such other courses permitted by the University.
6. The examinations shall be held at the end of each academic year on the dates fixed by the University.
7. Each annual examination shall consist of Six theory papers of 70 marks each and five practicals of 60 marks each.

7 Each candidate shall be allowed two attempts other than main examination to clear the back paper failing which he/ she shall have to appear in all the theory papers and practicals as an ex-student. However, his/ her internal assessment marks shall be carried forward. Provided further that the candidate shall not be allowed more than two attempts as ex-student. If the candidate who does not succeed in two attempts as ex-student shall have to forgo the academic programme. The total time period to pass B. Pharmacy course shall not be more than 8 years with effect from his/ her first admission as already provided in the item 1 of this ordinance.

8 The student shall be declared only as Pass/ Fail/ ATKT for the First, Second and Third Years. The result of the fourth year shall be declared with his/ her division. Those candidates obtaining 60 percent or more marks in aggregate shall be declared in First Division. Those of the successful candidates securing 50 percent or more than 50 percent shall be declared having secured Second Division.

rest of the regulations for this course, whatever has not been covered herein, shall be governed by the general Ordinance of the University.

8. There shall be three internal assessment tests, spread over whole session, of 15 marks each for each theory course out of which the marks of best two test shall be added to the theory marks in each paper.

9. There shall be three internal assessment tests spread over whole session of 20 marks each for each practical courses out of which the marks of best two tests shall be added to the practical marks.

10. The marks obtained by the candidates in the internal assessment shall be displayed on the notice-board of the institute after each test.

11. The Head of the Institute shall maintain a complete record of marks obtained by each candidate in internal assessments of theory as well as practicals and submit the marks to the Registrar atleast 10 days before the commencement of the examination.

12. No candidate shall be allowed to appear at the annual examination unless he/she secures atleast 40% marks in the internal assessments of each theory and practical courses separately.

13. In order to pass an examination an examinee shall be required to obtain atleast 45% marks in each theory paper and internal assessment taken together.

The candidate shall be required to obtain atleast 50% of total marks allotted to each practical together with internal assessment.

14. A candidate who fails to secure the prescribed minimum marks in not more than one theory and one practical course shall be promoted to next higher class at his/her option. The candidate shall appear in this paper and or practical along with the next examination. The candidate shall be required to pay the examination fee for the back paper (s) as

prescribed by the University.

Provided that the candidate shall not be promoted to third year unless he/she has cleared all the courses of first year.

Provided further that no candidate shall be promoted to fourth year unless he/she has cleared of the courses of second year.

15. Each candidate shall be allowed two attempts to clear the back paper/practical failing which he/she shall have to appear in all the papers and practical a fresh as ex-student. His/her internal assessment marks shall be carried over. Provided that that candidate shall be allowed only two attempts as ex-student. If the candidate does not succeed in two attempts as ex-student he/she shall have to leave this academic programme.

16. An unsuccessful candidate shall be given only two subsequent chances to appear in all the papers/practicals as ex-student failing which he/she shall have to leave this academic programme.

17. The results of first, second and third years shall be declared as pass/fail/ATKT. The result of fourth year shall be declared with division. The candidates obtaining 60% or more marks in aggregate shall be placed in First Division, rest of the successful candidates shall be placed in Second Division.

18. The number of students admitted to this course shall be as per permission granted by the competent authority from time to time. Reservation policy shall be followed as per State Government Rules.

19. Fees for the course shall be as per norms of the State Government laid down from time to time.

**ORDINANCE - 72**  
**Bachelor of Pharmacy**  
**(Sec. 37 (ii) and 39 (i))**

**Nomenclature & Duration**

The course herewith will be called the Bachelor of Pharmacy (B. Pharma). The course shall ordinarily be of Four Years duration. Each candidate shall be allowed to complete the course within a stipulated period and not more than Eight Years.

**Admission**

The admission to the course shall be granted on the basis of the merit secured at the entrance test, which may be conducted either by the University or by any other authorized body constituted by the state of Madhya Pradesh.

Candidates having passed Diploma in Pharmacy from AICTE recognized Institutions shall be eligible for direct admission to second year of B. Pharmacy course provided the seat is available. Further, such candidates shall have to pass an additional course either in Mathematics or Biology as the case may be as prescribed in the B. Pharmacy first year.

**Eligibility**

The minimum qualification for admission to the first year of the B. Pharmacy (B. Pharma) course shall be Fifty Percent marks at the 10 + 2 examination of M.P. Higher Secondary Board or any other examination recognized by the University to be equivalent to 10 + 2 examination with General English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics or Biology as subjects.

A student admitted to this course shall pursue it as a regular candidate of the University and therefore, shall not be permitted to take up study of any other course.

## Examination Scheme

- 4.1 The examinations shall be held at the end of each academic year on the dates fixed by the University.
- 4.2 The internal assessment will consist of 20 percent of the total marks assigned to the each theory and the practical course. There shall be three internal assessment tests, spread over the session, for each Theory and Practical course. Out of three, tests the marks of two best tests of the student will be added for theory and practical tests separately
- 4.3 No candidate shall be allowed to appear at the annual examination unless he/she secures minimum of 45 percent of the maximum marks assigned to the internal assessments of each theory and practical courses, separately.
- 4.4 In order to pass an examination, a student shall be required to obtain not less than 45 percent of the maximum marks allotted to each theory paper, practical and internal assessment separately.  
Further the candidate shall be declared pass for a particular session only after he/ she secures an aggregate of 50 percent of the total of theory and practical separately.
- 4.5 Each candidate shall be required to under go a practical training of at least six weeks after third or fourth year examination. The degree of B. Pharma shall not be awarded to a candidate unless the condition laid down in this clause is fulfilled.
- 4.6 A candidate failing in not more than two papers, combining theory and practical together, shall be awarded ATKT and shall be promoted to next higher class.  
Provided that the candidate shall not be promoted to third year unless he/she has cleared all the papers of first year.  
Provided further that no candidate shall be promoted to fourth year unless he/she has cleared all the papers of second year.

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- 4.7 Each candidate shall be allowed two attempts other than main examination to clear the back paper failing which he/ she shall have to appear in all the theory papers and practicals as an ex-student. However, his/ her internal assessment marks shall be carried forward. Provided further that the candidate shall not be allowed more than two attempts as ex-student. If the candidate who does not succeed in two attempts as ex-student shall have to forgo the academic programme. The total time period to pass B. Pharmacy course shall not be more than 8 years with effect from his/ her first admission as already provided in the item 1 of this ordinance.
- 4.8 The student shall be declared only as Pass/ Fail/ ATKT for the First, Second and Third Years. The result of the fourth year shall be declared with his/ her division. Those candidates obtaining 60 percent or more marks in aggregate shall be declared in First Division. Those of the successful candidates securing 50 percent or more than 50 percent shall be declared having secured Second Division.

Rest of the regulations for this course, whatever has not been covered herein, shall be governed by the general Ordinance of the University.
